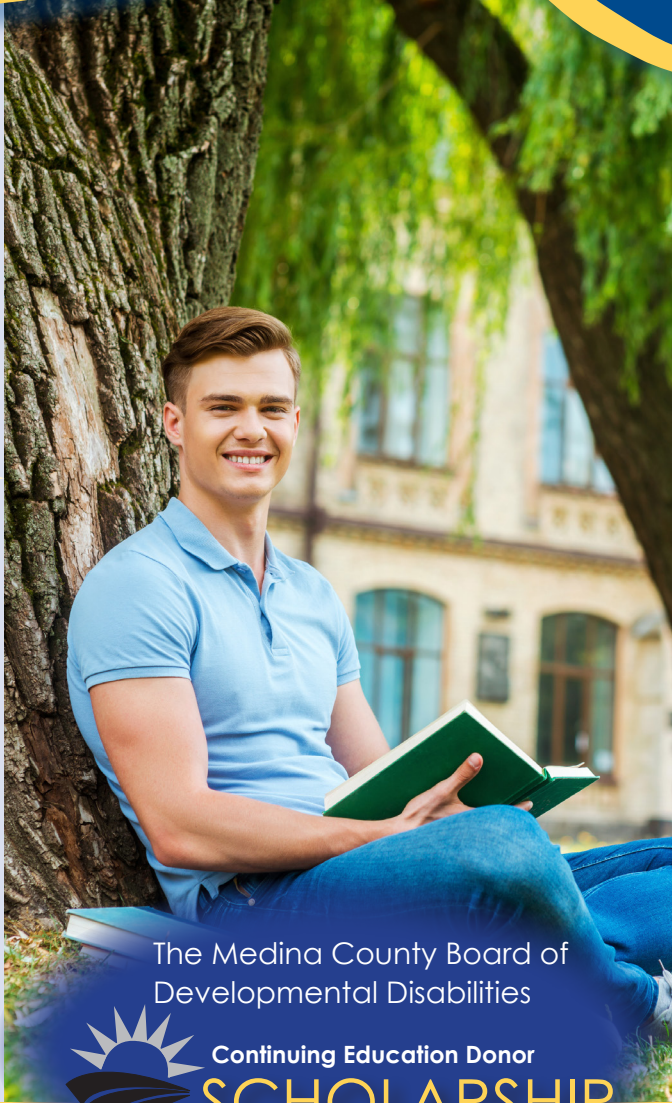

ABOUT AWARD

THE Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities' (MCBDD) Continuing Education Donor Scholarship is awarded to a former MCBDD Donor or Continuing Education Scholarship recipient. The MCBDD Donated Funds Committee administers the scholarship which is awarded on or around May 1st of each year.



ELIGIBILITY

APPLICANTS must be a former MCBDD Donor or Continuing Education Scholarship recipient within the past five years.

APPLICANTS must be enrolled in an accredited training program in a field providing services to individuals with developmental disabilities. (i.e. special education, physical therapy, social work, behavioral sciences, etc.)

APPLICANTS must have completed at least 12 credit hours of coursework in the last twelve months.

APPLICANTS must have maintained a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 or higher.

APPLICANTS must demonstrate continued involvement in the field of developmental disabilities through any of the following:

- volunteer activities which provide service to individuals with developmental disabilities
- job shadowing
- internships or practicums
- related field experiences
- Special Olympics

APPLICATIONS

INTERESTED students must complete a Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities' Continuing Education Donor Scholarship application form. Forms are available by calling 330-725-7751 ext. 273 or through our website at www.mcbdd.org. Applicants must submit an application each year they wish to be considered for the scholarship. Deadline for submitting a complete application is the end of March each year. Check current application for submission deadline.

CRITERIA

AWARDS will be based on information as provided on the Continuing Education Scholarship application form.

CONSIDERATION will also be given to the student's total involvement in programs and activities sponsored by the Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities.
