empowering families

As individuals with developmental disabilities become adults there are many opportunities available. The Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities (MCBDD) is proud to promote these opportunities and empower individuals and their families as they make choices for the future.

How do you receive MCBDD services?

Our Eligibility Specialists can answer your questions and help you with the forms that must be completed before eligibility for MCBDD services can be considered. An Eligibility Specialist may be contacted at 330-725-7751 ext. 258.

Who is eligible?

Guidelines for eligibility are set by the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD). Generally speaking, individuals 16 and older are considered eligible for MCBDD services if they show at least three areas of substantial limitations on the Ohio Eligibility Determination Instrument (OEDI) and provide documented evidence of a life-long developmental disability.

When will you know?

Once all forms are completed, reviewed and the OEDI is performed (if applicable), you will receive a letter - within 45 days - informing you of your eligibility determination.

If you receive a letter stating that you/your family member is NOT eligible for MCBDD services, we can recommend other supports. You may appeal the decision. An Eligibility Specialist will provide you with information on how to use the appeal process.



Services available through the Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities include:

Service and Support Administration (SSA) - help for families to identify, coordinate and get the appropriate services and programs needed to ensure a safe and healthy lifestyle.

Vocational Training & Placement - opportunities for the necessary training and support to promote community based employment.

Residential Supports - support that helps people find the services necessary to live how and where they choose.

Social/Recreation Programs - opportunities to develop social skills and relationships within the community.

Family Support Services (FSS) - financial support to help families care for their family member with disabilities at home.

Positive Support Services* - resources, strategies and information to address challenging behaviors.

Transportation* - help in finding the needed transportation to be an involved citizen in the community.

Assistive Technology* - device used to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of an individual with a disability.
