

LEVY RENEWAL

November 5, 2019



Since this operating levy passed in 2010, we have seen:

- 147% increase in Early Intervention Services for young children (ages 0-3)
- 61% increase in the number of people we have helped find employment
- 54% increase in caseloads for Service and Support Administration (Case Management)
- 58% increase in number of service waivers for which we have funding responsibility

Over the past ten years, the MCBDD has leveraged these levy funds to bring over \$106 million in federal taxpayer money back to services and programs in Medina County.

The MCBDD levy is a renewal, NOT A NEW TAX.

The Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities, also known as the Achievement Center and Windfall School, is placing a 1.12 mill renewal levy on the November 5, 2019 ballot.

This is not a new tax or increase in tax. Renewing the levy will continue to cost a homeowner about \$2.71 per month on a \$100,000 home.

This levy ensure funding for vital services for people with developmental disabilities including:

- Early intervention
- Education
- Employment programs
- Transportation
- Residential support
- Community inclusive living

If this levy fails, all areas of service will be substantially reduced or cut.
