We are now offering Homemaker Personal Care Direct Support Professional (HPC DSP) Retention Bonus Support for Agency Providers.

The Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities recognizes the significant impact the Direct Support Professional (DSP) shortage is having on the availability and the quality of services in the county. The MCBDD believes it is critical to continue to offer an array of supports to providers through this staffing shortage crisis to ensure quality and necessary

Under this program, agency providers who provide Homemaker Personal Care (HPC) services are eligible for consideration to receive payments to be used towards retention bonuses for HPC DSP staff. **PROGRAM SUMMARY** 

## **Retention Amounts**

DSP's must work the entire calendar month to be eligible for the retention bonus.

**40+ Hours** - DSPs working an average 40+ hours per week in an **HPC capacity** and who work 100% of their scheduled work shifts for the month are eligible for up to \$300 per month retention bonus.

**20-39 Hours** - DSPs working an average of 20 to 39 hours per week in an **HPC capacity** and who work 100% of their scheduled work shift for the month are eligible for up to \$150 per month retention bonus.

#### **Provider Agency**

A provider agency will need to sign and return an "Agreement for Provider Assistance" form to the MCBDD Director of Community Development prior to requesting retention bonuses through this program.

Provider agencies will need to submit documentation on the appropriate form with the DSP's name, HPC hours worked, and the current monthly retention bonus amount paid with date of payment to DSP.

Provider agencies will be required to attest to the fact that a DSP worked those scheduled hours in Medina County, serving an individual served by an authorized MCBDD ISP.

Payments will be made directly to the provider agency.
