What Happens After Early Intervention Services?

As your child gets closer to their third birthday, your family will begin "transition planning." This is an important time, because Early Intervention services are only offered up until age three.

As part of this transition, your child's services and supports will change and most likely be moving from a "Family Focused" method to a more "Child Focused" method. You may be curious about what you should expect and what this means for your child and your family.

Community Options

Any community option which helps your child continue to grow in social, verbal, fine and gross motor skills and thinking/problem solving.

Public School

Your child may move from an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) to an Individualized Education Program (IEP). This document will have goals and objectives to address your child's unique needs to prepare for kindergarten.
